American Indian Summer Institute	Students will work with professors, college students, and invited American Indian community members during their stay in the in the campus dormitories, learning about the university environment, improving study skills, and preparing for college. All students in the program will receive follow-up mentorship by UC staff and admissions counselors throughout their remaining years of high school, which will include guidance in choosing their coursework, financial aid, and applying to a university.	4/30
